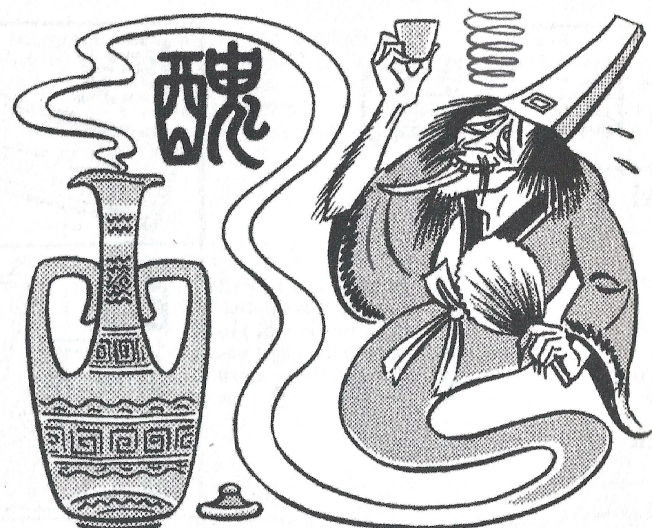


丑 (醜)

CHǒU shameful; ugly

TWO types of spirits were integrated to form the character for shame and ugliness: spirit or liquor (酉) from a wine jar, and an evil spirit (鬼) from the invisible realm. The result is a hideous drunken (酉) devil (鬼) or 醜, representing ugliness, now hidden under the simplified form: 丑 of a clown.
